#### From the Pastor's Desk

We need to stop and reflect on the opening lines of our second reading this weekend from the First Letter of St. Paul to Timothy. "Beloved: first of all, I ask that supplications, prayers, petitions, and thanksgiving be offered for everyone, for kings and all in authority, that we may lead a quiet and tranquil life in all devotion and dignity."

The current state of events seems to show that we ain't prayin' enough! We are not praying enough for our leaders to be people of goodwill and compassion. We are not praying enough for tranquility and peace. Let me be clear in stating it is not about praying for the death or demise of people or groups with whom we disagree. It is about a conversion of heart for each of us no matter what our role in the governing process. We the governed MUST pray for the governing. Those entrusted with leadership need to live up to the responsibility to protect the God given dignity of each person created in God's image.

The results will not be created by legislative or judicial actions. They will have to be spiritual: the result of supplication, prayer, petition and eventually yes, even thanksgiving as St. Paul states. In God's eyes there are no Democrats or Republicans, Independents or Unaffiliated, left/right, conservative/moderate/liberal. There are only people. His people. Each one loved by Him with love beyond all telling. When we understand this (and only when we understand this) we will have a quiet and tranquil life in all devotion and dignity.
